The huge fire began early in the morning in a tiny bakery on Pudding Lane owned by a man called Thomas Farriner. He'd forgotten to put out the fire in his oven the night before. Samuel Pepys was worried that the fire was becoming too large, and asked King Charles II for help.

St Paul's Cathedral was destroyed by fire.	The fire was finally put out. It had destroyed 87 churches and 13,200 houses.
