


Everyday heroes

Rosa Louise McCauley was born in Tuskegee, Alabama, USA.	Rosa married Raymond Parks at the age of 19.	Rosa boarded the bus home and sat in the first row of seats for black people. She refused to move to the back of the bus to allow a white person to sit down. Rosa was arrested for not doing as the driver said.	The Montgomery Bus Boycott began. It lasted 381 days. 40,000 black people and some white people refused to use the buses.	The boycott officially ended.	The Civil Rights Act was passed.	Rosa published her first book, 'Rosa Parks, My Story.'	Rosa Parks died in Detroit, Michigan.
